



PAPER EDITING REQUIREMENTS

General Requirements:

- The entire paper must be written in **English**, in Word format.
- Fonts: The entire paper, including tables, must be written in **Times New Roman (TNR)**
- Line spacing: 1 line
- Length: do not exceed **6 pages**.
- Page setup: A4, margins of 25 mm.

Paper Title:

- **TNR, size 14, uppercase, bold, alignment: Center.**
- Placed three lines below the top of the page.

Author Name(s):

- TNR, size 12, bold, alignment: Center.
- Placed two lines below the paper title.
- **A maximum of 3 authors per paper is allowed**, plus the coordinating professor.

Author(s) Institution:

- TNR, size 12, alignment: Center.
- Placed one line below the author names.

Paper Content:

- TNR, size 12, alignment: Justify.
- Placed two lines below the abstract.
- Paragraphs begin 12.5 mm (1 Tab) from the left margin.
- Paragraph titles: TNR, size 12, italic, alignment: Justify, starting at the left margin, with one blank line above.

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- Illustrations must be numbered as follows:

Figure 6. (TNR, 12, Center alignment, placed below the figure).

- Tables must be numbered as follows:

Table 9. (TNR, 12, Center alignment, placed above the table).

- Bibliographic references are indicated in parentheses, as follows: (3).

Bibliography:

- Bibliographic entries must be written in TNR, size 12, alignment: Justify, as follows:
3. Dell, G. M. (2022), *Understanding Batteries*, Cambridge, The Royal Society of Chemistry.
 4. Steven, P. (2025). *High-Drain Alkaline AA-Batteries* in “Popular Electronics”, London, pp. 52-68.

Note:

- Authors bear full responsibility for the content of the submitted papers. All papers will be checked using **Plagiarism Detector** and the maximum allowed similarity percentage is **20%**.
- The Scientific Committee **will evaluate** the papers based on the criteria listed below. A ranking will be created, and awards will be granted accordingly
- The Scientific Committee **will decide** on the publication of the awarded papers. Authors whose papers are accepted for publication will be notified by **October 1st** of the current year.
